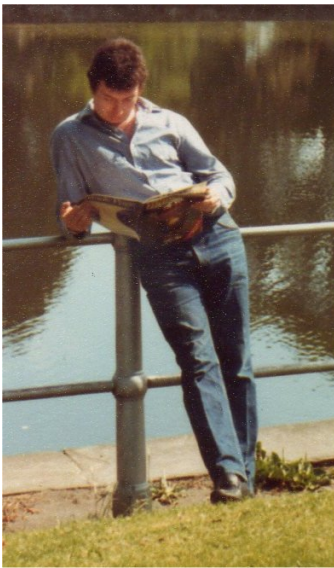

# RAMBLINGS OF A FORMER CAPTAIN

My first contact with Chesham Bois Cricket Club was as a member of Bellingdon and Asheridge C.C. in the mid 1960's. I knew several of the then Bois players as we had gone through our schooling together.

The first actual match between the two sides that I can recall was not notable for any outstanding performances, or the result, indeed there was no result as the weather won the day. It was a damp overcast day with occasional drizzle, it was indeed drizzling when the captains tossed up.

The Bellingdon captain was David Hearn, who had joined us from the Bois a season or two previously, David won the toss and elected to bat.

I believe I opened the innings and as the rain increased the ground grew wetter and the Bois players were soon sporting some unusual cricketing apparel. Barry White was bowling from the road end and retrieved his umbrella from the umpire, Dick Colby, at the end of the over before retreating to long on. Ian Frankham had a very fetching bright yellow sou' wester perched on his head. I remember playing the ball into the covers and John Plested rolling up his whites to retrieve the ball from a large and growing larger puddle. In the end we all came to our senses and went home.

It was probably the following season that John Richardson and I transferred our allegiances to "the Bois". I think this caused a little bit of needle at Bellingdon at the time because on our first visit back there the home side was unusually strong in its line up. In deed they shot us out for about 76 and David Plested, who was a spectator that day, drove off muttering something like you're 100 runs short. It's all history now that Pete Arnold and John Richardson did what you might call a demolition job. Result Bellingdon 16 all out.

I have suffered many ups and downs in my playing career at the Bois, the majority of downs were undoubtedly self inflicted. I would like to recall a few of both.

For many matches I had the pleasure of opening the innings with two of the most prolific run getters ever to play for the Bois, firstly the sorely missed John Plested. Why was it that the opposition seemed to be mesmerised by his ungainly stance and continuously bowled at his leg stump? John was the first to admit that if they bowled at his off stump his scoring was limited, but most of them never learnt.

My next opening partner was Alan Lathwell, with more shots in his repertoire, but still with John's patience to build a big innings, which allowed me to go for my shots at the other end.

At this point I recall the biggest single disappointment, on the playing side, of my career as Alan was involved.

We used to have an all day fixture at Farnham Royal. On this occasion I seem to recall that one Doug Puddephatt had destroyed their very strong batting line up and I think we were chasing about 88 to win. Alan and I put on about 50 for the first wicket when the heavens opened and we spent the rest of the day in the pavilion. What might have been!

For several seasons I had the privilege of captaining "the Bois". What a captain's dream it was on occasions. I had Winnie and Puddephatt to open the bowling and Wood, Hinks and Richardson to follow. Alas injury to Doug Puddephatt and Bob Wood withdrew these two from the line up for some time.

Two games spring to mind here when I skippered sides with no front line strike bowlers but due to the gutsy spirit of lesser mortals outstanding results were achieved.

Playing The Hill, a useful Harrow side, on the common without my established "stars" the whole side gave me 110 percent and we achieved a great victory with memorable contributions from Don Crawford and Wyn Johns.

The second of these games took place on Ley Hill common. My opening bowlers were Don Clarke (off spin) and Syd Rolph. I recall we had batted first and had scored about 180, which, on Ley Hills ground and with our bowling attack was about 120 short of what was required. After getting within about 20 of our score for the loss of 3 or 4 wickets the Ley Hill batsmen committed suicide as Don and Syd responded to the realisation that our cause was not lost. They ended up hanging on for a draw with one wicket left.

I think the reason we never did better in the village cup was more a case of attitude than ability. We never did play to our full potential in that competition.

I was a member of the side which remained undefeated for so long and I was not the only one to relax and enjoy the cricket just a little bit more when the run came to an end. When I scored the 117 at Beaconsfield, which incidentally is the only long innings of my career that I can honestly say was completely chanceless, I was batting at number 3 and John Plested was out for 0, for him a rare occurrence. Mind you I can remember being bowled for 0 by a dead straight ball at Kimble and then watched Alan Lathwell and John Rance pile on the runs.

Despite what my old mate Syd might say to the contrary it was yours truly who made the original phone call to Mrs. Podger in Wiltshire. I had been given the names of four hostels to contact and fortunately for us she was the only one prepared to accommodate us. I remember the only way I could get to bed was to take off my shoes and wave my socks under the noses of the rest of the side, as the only television was in my room. I was also an instigator in the notorious "MANDINGO" affair, (see Syd Rolphs story).

For different reasons I have had three breaks away from the club. The first was when I was tempted to step up a rung and play for Ernest Turners of High Wycombe. Their side boasted three Bucks county players at the time but the pressure at a higher level took much of the enjoyment out of the game for me. I returned to the "Bois" before completing a whole season.

I am pleased to be back playing regularly at the time of writing.

What is it that keeps calling me back?

Why is it that so many people have such a long association with the club?

Other cricket teams locally have long standing players and supporters but none compare with "the Bois".

As Sydney says the club is bigger than one person.

Chesham Bois has been graced over the years by some great characters and long may it continue. The influx of new blood over the last few years has maintained the standard of cricket and the current batch of club officers are maintaining the high standards set by their predecessors. The new extension should guarantee that trend continues for many years to come.

The trend of Chesham Bois has always been to try to win but never at the expense of removing the enjoyment from the game.

Finally I would like to name my team selection from all those dear friends I have had the pleasure of turning out with over the years.
