## Chesham Bois scorch to a great victory

**CHESHAM** Bois stormed into the next round of the National Village Knockout Cricket Cup recording one of their best ever wins by scoring nearly 200 runs with a spirited reply after inserting Peppard.

With the clear indication of a good wicket and a fast outfield Chesham Bois had an early success but McCoy pulled Peppard round with an aggressive innings of 42.

This came abruptly to an end when Salethorne got him reaching on 68 and with Sawyer chipping in with a couple of wickets Chesham Bois were handsomely placed at the 20 over halfway stage restricting Peppard to 80-5.

The Peppard all-rounder Askwith had other plans as he brought his side back into the game with an aggressively controlled innings. He got good support from the lower order batsmen especially Rush although Mike Caidan for Bois bowled tightly. But the dour Askwith finished unbeaten on 62 including four sixes and pushed the Peppard score up to 191-9 at the 40 over close. Salethorne and Caidan were the pick of the Chesham Bois bowlers.

Now with the awesome task before them of a daunting 192 to win, at almost five an over, Chesham Bois were not helped by losing a wicket in the third over.

Once again though, as in previous rounds, Nokes laid the foundations for the Chesham Bois innings.

Along with Garner the scoring rate increased and was kept at a realistic four runs an over in the first half of the innings.

This still meant though that that six an over was required for the final 20 overs, but eight wickets were in hand.

# Arsonist strikes at cricket clubhouse

HEARTBROKEN members of Chesham Bois Cricket Club saw almost six years of work destroyed overnight when arsonists struck at their clubhouse.

It is believed that burglars got into the club's nearly completed extension on Wednesday night of last week, and when they could not find anything to steal, decided to set light to the place causing damage estimated at £10,000.

The alarm was raised by a passer-by who saw thick black smoke coming from the build-

ing. First on the scene were police who tackled the blaze and brought it under control.

Cricket club chairman, Sid Rolph, said the club had fought to get planning permission for over four years for the extension, and it was only last January that work finally began.

Mr Rolph said: "A clubhouse has stood on that site since 1854 but the growth of the club has meant that we needed larger facilities.

"We spent nearly five years raising money for the extension and then at the last minute we

were let down by the Sports Council who could not give us a grant so that we would have enough to get the project off the ground."

He described how members gave up their evenings and weekends to help dig foundations in a bid to save on costs. It was hoped the extension would be ready for next April and the beginning of the cricket season.

The club still hopes to meet this deadline once insurance as-

sessors have looked at the damage.

"The smoke damage is horrendous and it's such a shame to see so much hard work ruined by some mindless individuals," said Mr Rolph. "Members had raised over £12,000 to get this scheme underway and we have had generous support from Chesham Service Station who are the club's sponsors."

Mr Rolph also asked that anyone wishing to make a donation to the cricket club should contact secretary Kenneth Williams on Amersham 433098.

Disaster struck in early December 1990 when a pavilion break-in occurred. After searching the pavilion and finding nothing of value the culprits decided to set a fire amid some rummage left over from a recent Jumble Sale.

Smoke and soot covered everything throughout the pavilion and new extension area, including the cricket kit, making it unusable. All the recently completed decorating work was ruined in moments. Luckily the club was fully insured, therefore cost would not be a problem. The insurance money enabled the club to get the professionals in to redecorate. The clubhouse was thus in readiness for the start of the 1991 cricket season.
