It is very pleasing for me to write a foreword to the Chesham Bois Cricket Club History Book.

This book has a particular attraction for me not only as Club Chairman but because of my own and my families long association with this fine and unique village cricket club, which, in a lovely setting, has stood the test of time.

It is generally accepted that the club was formed around 1900 and I remember my late father telling me that both he and my uncle used to turn out for the club.

In this book you will read with interest articles by Geoffrey Keen, Fred Willis, Len Barker, Stafford Burbridge, Peter Arnold and others which gradually piece together the clubs history as is possible to determine at present.

Just after the Second World War in 1945 I can remember as a lad joining the club whilst I and some of my colleagues were members of Chesham Bois Youth Club.

The cricket club had been disbanded during the war years and I remember when we decided to restart in 1944 that in order to provide an adequate playing area it was necessary to cut down and remove a quantity of gorse bushes which grew in abundance.

I am very proud to feel that nearly forty years later I am still endeavouring to turn out and play numerous matches during the season.

It is with much regret that for reasons beyond our control club scorebooks earlier than 1960 are not in our possession and the true consistent records can only be set out from then on.

This record book covers many areas from nostalgia concerning the past club records, club history and above all reminiscing over games played and friendships made. I am glad to say that so far as stories, both truth and rumour are concerned we are particularly indebted to articles which have been provided by old and current members.

Good friends of the club who do not necessarily come to the fore by way of records are sometimes harder to remember and I certainly do not wish to be criticised for remembering some and forgetting others.

However I do feel it would be wrong not to mention the late Bill Washington who to a very ripe old age scored for us and for some eleven years during his reign he was joined by another old timer Tom Gomm, who umpired for the club.

In this day and age when equality of the sexes really does count we must not forget the Ladies who over many years have supported the club by looking after the club catering arrangements. Many names come to mind over the years and it would be wrong of me to single out any particular names bearing in mind that we go right back to 1945 and it is only fair to say that they have not been forgotten.

I could go on and on but will refrain from doing so. Apart from ending on what is, possibly, one of the most important reasons for compiling and presenting this book and that is to say the immense value and pleasure which I hope it will give to present and future members of the cricket club, who when turning the pages can see what has already been done and ensure that they help to continue the history and character of the club and that they can also set their sights on endeavouring to better every record so far recorded, which in its way will maintain and enhance the standard of good village cricket which has been played on our common all these years.

It is indeed most worthwhile, particularly in an age when possibly village cricket is in some areas slowly dying, that Bob Wood and his colleagues who have worked very hard on the preparation of this book are to be sincerely congratulated on their efforts.

THE VILLAGE AND CRICKET TEAM OF CHESHAM BOIS A BRIEF HISTORY

Chesham Bois is situated between Chesham and Amersham and the cricket ground is on the common between North Road and South Road. Recognition of Chesham Bois as a settlement separate from Chesham dates back to the time of the Domes Day Book, 1086.

The village was a Saxon manor given by William the Conqueror to his half brother Odo, the Bishop of Bayeaux. Contrary to popular belief the village does not take its name from the French word for wood, despite having a Bois Wood and a Great Bois Wood within the village boundaries.

During the reign of King John the manor came into the hands of William du Bois (different spellings have it as du Boyes or de Bosco) a Norman family.

William du Bois built a manor house around 1213 with a family chapel near by. The house was demolished in 1812 but the chapel forms the chancel of the present church of St. Leonard.

Today Chesham Bois has been physically absorbed into the town of Amersham, but villagers still retain a sense of separate identity. There is a fight to keep it as a village, but as the village grows it does change, but it still seems to keep its rural character.

Kingfishers and wild ducks still colour the village pond, situated along North Road close to the cricket ground, from time to time. The pond was formed by the digging of clay for bricks. (circa 1716-1735)

In the 1980's, while doing repair work on the cricket square, concrete foundations were found but not investigated as it would have meant digging up a large area of the square. Could these have been the remains of a kiln used in the brick making process?

The common provides the ideal setting for typical village cricket, the ground being completely enclosed by large trees and shrubbery. When in full bloom these provide a most agreeable background to while away the summer hours in the pursuit of cricket. Many opposing teams comment on the attraction of playing in this setting.

The generally accepted date of formation of the Chesham Bois Cricket Club is 1880, though no proof has yet been found. Cricket has been played on Bois Common at North Road since 1891 with the inevitable breaks for the two World Wars. Matches before this date were played on The Moor/Lower Bois area.

Definite verbal conformation from old players and local villagers in the early 1960's of a team playing on the common prior to 1900 was given to then club members.

In 1982 a few club members were discussing the history and decided to do something positive and leave something for future players to look back at, these pages being the result of all their labours.

CHESHAM BOIS C.C. ON THE MOOR 1880 – 1890

Further research in 2011 has shown that the newspaper extracts for the early 1800's that refer to Chesham Bois Common were actually played on Chesham Moor.

Both the Upper and Lower Moor areas were part of the Chesham Bois parish in the early 1800's with the River Chess providing a natural boundary to the parish. However, both of these areas would have been unsuitable for serious cricket matches due to the nature of the ground, most certainly wet and swampy due to both areas being enclosed by the River Chess and multiple water cress beds within the area, a thriving local industry in the 1800's. Fields the other side of the water cress beds, in the area next to Bois Moor Road known as Lower Bois, may have provided suitable areas for the playing of sport, this area was also referred to as The Moor. (See photograph below dated 1888).

The photograph of 1888 shows the direction of the railway line which obviously crosses the area (Marked 'X') where cricket matches could possibly have been played.

A verbal confirmation of cricket being played in the field(s) behind the present day swimming pool area was obtained in April 2012 from Mr. Rodney Sedgwick, a gentleman who has been a long term resident of Chesham, this is most probably the Hodds Wood Road / Millfields housing area. However no documental proof is available at present. Therefore the early Chesham Bois C.C. matches, from the estimated formation of the club in 1880 until the late1880's, were probably played on Lower Bois / The Moor and not Chesham Bois Common at North Road.

Obviously the opening of the railway in 1889 would have meant that the club would have had to move their ground, i.e. to Bois Common (North Road), to continue playing cricket. For a number of years after Chesham Bois C.C. moved to Bois Common other teams continued to play at various locations on The Moor.

These Chesham Bois Parish boundaries were in place until 1934 when they passed on to Chesham Council and new boundaries were established.

Another theory is that with Chesham Bois Manor being in the area the fielded area mentioned previously may have been known locally as Chesham Bois Common.

Lower Bois Common / The Moor

The following match reports for the early 1800's until 1890, although stated as being played on Chesham Bois Common, actually refer to a location on the Chesham Moor/Lower Bois area and not North Road, Bois Common.

The common has been used for cricket since at least 1836, when the first recorded game was found, long before the formation of the present Chesham Bois Cricket Club in 1880. It had been used by various teams throughout the area and further investigation may indeed provide an earlier instance.

The first recorded match on Chesham Bois Common is in 1836 between Chesham and St. Albans.

TUESDAY 26TH JULY 1836. Chesham played St. Albans on Chesham Bois common. St. Albans, formed in 1666, noted as being the best side in Hertfordshire. (Bucks Herald)


NOTE:-

The score card is obviously not correct by today's reckoning of the totals. Chesham required 7 more runs to win but could not continue batting to complete the victory so, as was the way of deciding matches in the early days, Chesham were victorious on the first innings score.


THURSDAY 25TH AUGUST 1836.St. Albans played Chesham at St. Albans. St. Albans won the return match by 15 runs. (Bucks Herald)

The tithe map of 1838 (see below) shows, as indicated by the map surveyor, Bois Common was covered in gorse bushes that were used in the firing of the brick kilns located in "Brick Field " south east of the current cricket field. The first trees on the common were planted in the 1830's, to shield the rectory from the kilns, followed by the planting of the oak trees in 1919 after the First World War.

This report shows that Bois Common was not suitable, at this time, for matches to be played there.

From 1836 onwards the common was used for many other games of cricket between various Chesham town teams, such as, the Charity Lodge of Odd Fellows, the boot makers and wooden ware sides and local schools cricket are all recorded.

FRIDAY 7TH AUGUST 1840. Chesham played Tring Park. (No match details given)

JULY 1842. Chesham played Chenies & Latimer. Match won by Chenies & Latimer (no scores given).

JULY 1843. Chesham played Hemel Hempstead. (No match details given).

SATURDAY 22ND AUGUST 1846. Chesham played Tring Park on Chesham Bois Common. Chesham scored 84 and 62. Tring scored 52 and 65. Chesham won by 29 runs. (Bucks Gazette)

MONDAY 31ST AUGUST 1846. A cricket match between the Woodenware Manufacturers of Chesham and the Boot Makers of Chesham took place on Chesham Bois Common.

Mr. E. Stratford led the Woodenware team and Mr. Thomas Mayo, although a woodenware manufacturer, led the Boot Makers team.

Mr. Stratford's team scored 34 and 27, Mr. Mayo's team scored 32 and 32 for 3 wickets, the boot makers winning by 7 wkts. Special mention was made of the good fielding of Mr. Joseph Mayo, 12 years old. 40 people sat down to tea in a nearby dell surrounding the pitch. After the match a single wicket match was played between Mr. Webb and Mr. Jesse Mayo. The former won the match. (Bucks Gazette)

MONDAY 14TH SEPTEMBER 1846. A return match between the Woodenware Manufacturers of Chesham and the Boot Makers of Chesham took place on Chesham Bois Common. The Boot Manufacturers scored 75 and 42. The Woodenware Manufacturers scored 49 and 53, the boot makers winning by 15 runs. (Bucks Gazette)

SEPTEMBER 1847. Chesham played Aylesbury. A return match played on Chesham Bois Common. Aylesbury scored 82 and 111, Chesham 35 and 75. Aylesbury won by 83 runs.

The Chesham team: Mr Stratford, J. Webb, Christmas, T. Webb, Curtis, Sells, Geary, Dickson, Spratley, G. Climpson, G. Webb.

The teams retired to the George Inn for dinner. (Bucks Gazette)

FRIDAY 8TH SEPTEMBER 1848. Chesham played Aylesbury on Chesham Bois Common. Chesham scored 31 and 31, Aylesbury scored 48 and 15 for 2. Aylesbury won by 8 wkts.

SEPTEMBER 1848. Chesham played Missenden on Chesham Bois Common. Chesham scored 42 and 42 for 8 wkts. Missenden scored 49 and 21. Chesham won by 2 wkts.

FRIDAY 29TH JUNE 1849. Chesham played Kings Langley on Chesham Bois Common. Chesham scored 70 and 48. Kings Langley scored 58 and 48 for 2 wkts. The match was drawn as play ceased at 7 o'clock.

MONDAY 9TH JULY 1849. Chesham played a Combined XI from Missenden, Kingshill and Prestwood on Chesham Bois Common. Chesham scored 42 and 42 for 2wkts. M.K.P. XI scored 49 and 29. Chesham won by 8 wkts.

MONDAY 30TH JULY 1849. Chesham 2nd XI played the combined XI from Missenden, Kingshill and Prestwood on Chesham Bois Common. Chesham 2nd XI scored 33 and 31. The M.K.P. XI scored 53 and 22 for 3wkts. The M.K.P. XI won by 7 wkts.

MONDAY 20TH AUGUST 1849. Chesham Butchers played Aylesbury Butchers on Chesham Bois Common. Chesham Butchers scored 31 and 31. Aylesbury Butchers scored 48 and 15 for 0 wkts. Aylesbury won by 10 wkts.

MONDAY 27TH AUGUST 1849. Chesham played Aylesbury on Chesham Bois Common. Chesham scored 31 and 31. Aylesbury scored 48 and 15 for 2 wkts. Aylesbury won by 8 wkts.

1850. Aylesbury played Beaconsfield on Chesham Bois Common. This match on a neutral ground was to settle the result from two previous matches that had ended with no result owing to unfinished games. Beaconsfield had bowled underarm resulting in a prolonged innings by Aylesbury. Aylesbury had bowled round arm and dismissed Beaconsfield in less overs, hence the undecided match results. The final match rules were based on a no time out situation. (Bucks Herald)

MONDAY 2ND SEPTEMBER 1850. Chesham played Chipperfield and Sarrat on Chesham Bois Common. Chesham scored 39 and 84. Chipperfield and Sarratt scored 43 and 80, the match ending in a tie.

MONDAY 9TH AUGUST 1852. Chesham played Watford on Chesham Bois Common. Chesham won the match by an innings. (Bucks Gazette)

8TH JULY 1854. (The Bucks Advertiser)

"Chesham Cricket Club is to be revived after a lapse of many years" (First formed 1846)

22ND JULY 1854. (The Bucks Advertiser)

Cricket Chesham v Amersham.

A match between two elevens from these places was played at Chesham Bois Common, which terminated in favour of the latter. The players and their friends adjourned to the Crown inn for supper.

The scores were:- Chesham 49 and 12 for 3 Amersham 40 and 20

Chesham won by 7 wickets.

The Chesham team was:-

MONDAY 9TH AUGUST 1856. Chesham played Aylesbury on Chesham Bois Common. Chesham scored 45 and 132. Aylesbury scored 34 and 98. Chesham won by 45 runs. (Bucks Gazette)

MATCH OF CRICKET BETWEEN CHESHAM AND AYLESBURY CLUBS.

On Monday last, this match took place or. Hois Common, the excitement being immense. The odds were in favour of the Aylesbury players, and on their appearance at the spot, the turn became a little more advantageous to them. Some discussion arose with respect to Mr. Mann being included in the eleven, his name not

being sent down; but it was ultimately decided that gentleman should play.

The Chesham gentlemen first appeared at the wickets, and R. Page, with Monday, handled the willow, and and R. Page, with Monday, handled the willow, and played cautiously, the first making three singles, when Woodhouse caught him, and Christmas took his place; Monday batted well, and placed sixteen to the total, by one five, two was and the rest singles. Christmas and Mayo now faced each other, and it was evident that youth and age cannot go the same pace, for here, by the stiffness of the former gentleman, he caused Mr. Mayo's timbers to be damiged when he was away by desire. Mr. Webb followed, and strange to state, the same misfortune awaited him, both being invited to come away by Christmas. Mr. Mann next took the ball into Woodhouse's hands, after scoring one three and two singles. T. Page told the up by one five, one two, and five singles! The remainder; with the exception of one to Dickenson, did nothing. The fielding of the Aylesbury players was the theme of admiration; they never let a chance slip, and many were the plaudits that sounded from the booths. It was very much, at this time, in favour of the Vale, but to the much, at this time, in favour of the Vale, but to the determined courage of the Chesham players may be attributed the change.

The Aylesbury gentlemen then stood to the bowling, of Mann and Christmas, and batted very scientifically, but, unfortunately, no less than five of the members were caught out, Messrs. Neal and Woodhouse making six each, the first bowled by Christmas and the latter by Mann. Marks made seven, by one two and the rest singles, and then mismeasured his distance, the whole being got out for 34 runs. The betting now assumed a different aspect.

Mosers Mann and Page then wort in, the former scoring seven, when his wickets were lowered by Horwood. Mr. Monday added seven, and Mr. Stone thirteen, to the score. Mr. Mayo then took the bat, and his play certainly was very line—he made four fours, a five, and a six, and his him for twos were innumerable.

TUESDAY 24TH JULY 1860. Cambridge House School played the British School on Chesham Bois Common. British School 26 and 39, Cambridge House 54 and 12 for 6. (Bucks Gazette)

MONDAY 30TH JULY 1860. Chesham played Harefield on Chesham Bois Common. Chesham scored 93 and 77, Harefield 83 and 27 for 6. Chesham won the match on the first innings score. (Bucks Gazette)

MONDAY 30TH JUNE 1862. Chesham played Amersham on Chesham Bois Common. Chesham scored 31 and 53, Amersham 111. Amersham won by 27 runs. (Bucks Gazette)

SATURDAY 12TH JULY 1862. Chesham Brass Band played Bovingdon C.C. on Chesham Bois Common. The Brass Band played from the north end of Chesham to the common. On winning the match by 11 runs the band played 'see the Conquering Hero' on the return to Chesham. (Bucks Gazette)

1863. Chesham C.C. moved from Chesham Bois Common to a new ground in Higham Mead, Chesham.

1864. THE LAWS OF CRICKET WERE ALTERED TO ALLOW OVER ARM BOWLING.

SATURDAY 8TH JULY 1876. Webb and Sons played The Brush Makers on Chesham Bois Common. Webb XI scored 64 and 64, Brush Makers XI 71 and 33. The Webb XI won by 24 runs. (Bucks Gazette)

SATURDAY 23RD JUNE 1877. Cambridge School played National School on Chesham Bois Common. Cambridge School scored 76, National School 16 and 26. The National School included in their XI local names R. Beckley, W. Goss and W. Sears. Cambridge School won by 34 runs. (Bucks Gazette)

SATURDAY 7TH JULY 1877. The Brush Makers played Clickers and Riveters on Chesham Bois Common. (Bucks Gazette)

 16^{TH} AUGUST 1879. The British School played the National School on Chesham Bois Common. (Bucks Gazette)

19TH AUGUST 1880. Mr. Glasgow's XI played Mr. Webb's XI on Chesham Bois Common, (both gentlemen were Chesham C.C. members). J. Glasgow's XI scored 51 and 21. J. Webb's XI scored 38 and 38 for 1 wkt. J. Webb's XI won by 9 wkts.

1880 Chesham Cricket Club moved to 'The Meadow' Amy Lane from Higham Mead. The ground appears to be not completely available until the middle of 1881, with some matches being played on Chesham Bois Common. (see below)

17TH MAY 1881. Chesham played Harefield at Chesham Bois Common. Chesham scored 125, Harefield scored 29.

JULY 1881. Chesham played Amersham on Chesham Bois Common. Chesham scored 63 and 84, Amersham scored 15 and 11.

CHESHAM BOIS CRICKET CLUB A BRIEF HISTORY

The ground is in a picturesque setting being completely enclosed by beech and oak trees, some dating back many years. Teams are eager to play in such pleasant surroundings.

The actual formation of the Club is still uncertain at the present time but 1880 is the generally accepted date as in the 1960's when thoughts first turned to the history, there were ex-members and villagers who remembered the Club playing cricket prior to 1900. It had been in existence a number of years even then, playing the local villages in friendly matches.

From the early 1900's until 1940, the team played in the Chesham and District League, that featured many local village teams, winning the League on a number of occasions.

Only the two Great Wars stopped the club playing but it was quickly reformed on both occasions at the cessation of hostilities by many local enthusiasts who came mainly from the village and Chesham Moor areas. The latter being part of the local parish.

After reforming in 1947, the Club played only in friendly matches, fielding one Saturday eleven and two sides on most Sundays, when cricket was once again allowed to play Sunday matches in the 1950's after opposition by the churches nationwide.

These friendly matches were played for the next 50 years, despite the availability of league cricket in the area, this being purely a members preference to the friendly type of matches bringing lasting friendships between players.

In 1997, a decision was taken by the Club to once again enter into league cricket, this being the Mid-Bucks League which features many teams from the High Wycombe district but still retaining the Sunday friendly matches.

Although a small village club the standard of play and wickets are good and it has a reputation for friendliness and new members are always welcomed to the club.

This is the generally accepted date for the formation of the Club but as yet no officially documented proof has been found, (2010), although the local newspapers carried reports of matches in the mid 1880's. Between 1880 and 1890 the Club, like others in the previous reports, is thought to have played on another ground, almost certainly somewhere on the Chesham Moor area. Exactly where is, at present, uncertain. The present ground, however, was first played on competitively on 6th June1891 (see following report for that year).

As recorded for many seasons most of the Chesham Bois players lived in the Bois Moor Road area, this being part of the Chesham Bois parish at the time and was a large majority of the Parish population. The club may have played on the eventual ground of The Moor C.C., which was founded in the early 1900's.



Indeed when the Moor C.C. was first formed in 1904 it was by some ex Chesham Bois players. The two clubs, as stated previously, regularly used each others grounds in the early 1900's.

For the seasons 1908 and 1909 Chesham Bois were published as Bois Common C.C. before reverting to Chesham Bois C.C. in 1910. That year saw the Moor becoming Bois Moor C.C. as published.



There are no 'Examiner' press cuttings available for this year owing to fire damage at The British Library during World War Two.

This was the first season in which Chesham Bois (playing as Bois Common C.C.) won the league title, there being only one division at this time.

The team played under the captaincy of Arthur Aris.

In 1912 a cup was donated for the league winners by Mr. D.W. Oliver, Chairman of the league and a member of The Lee Cricket Club Another cup was donated by Mr. F. Wallington of the Chesham soft drinks firm for the division two winners. This division two cup was not played for until two divisions were formed in 1914. Unfortunately sometime either during the First World War or the early 1920's the division two cup became lost. At this time Mr. Oliver generously donated a replacement cup of a new design, having no handles, (as in Photograph A). This cup was presented as the Division One "Oliver Challenge Cup" and the original Division One "Oliver Cup" (Photograph B) became the Division Two Winners cup. At the present time (2010) what happened to the Wallington cup is not known and no photograph of it is available.

The facts were discovered in a 1929 report of a match between Chesham Bois C.C. and Chesham Conservative Club, played on Saturday 7th September. See extract below.



Season [1913 of the Chesham and District Cricket League terminated on Saturday last, at the Chesham Cricket meadow, with the customary match between the Champions and the Rest of the League. The Champions (Chesham Bois) were able to field a strong team—we should say as strong a team as has represented them on any other occasion during the season. A glance through the names which represented the "Rest," will convince the reader that a strong team was necessary. With such fine teams on the field, it was, therefore, not at all surprising that an interesting and hard fought-out game followed, with the "Rest" just able to snatch victory from Chesham Bois by the very small margin of six runs.

Batting first, the "Rest" put the Social first-wicket pair at the wicket, and Walter and Taylor did for their side on this occasion that which they have frequently done before for their own club—that is, each contributing their double-figure score. When playing for their own clubhese two players seldom leave the wicket before they have registered double figures, so that they should give, on this occasion, their side a good start with scores of 19 (Walter) and 14 (Taylor)

was not, therefore, surprising. It, is a pity that there is such a scarcity of reliable players in this respect. Worrell and J. T. Bavin were dismissed with ease by the attack, but a partnership followed which proved to be the best of the match. C. Wallis and W. Reynolds became associated, and a steady display followed, with a certain amount of confidence being shown by both batsmen. Between them the pair claimed 63 runs, W. Reynolds being responsible for 33 of them. The manner in which the next six batsmen were dispelled was, nothing short of a catastrophe, for only five runs were added to the score (Moreton 4), and four of the players suffering dismissal without scoring a single run. The total score was 118. It should be mentioned that the teams were playing twelve men aside, and that Mr. D. W. Oliver was an absentee from the ranks of the originally selected team for the "Rest."

Both Horwood and Tomlin were early dismissed on the Champion, side, and although A. Bolton was at the wicket for a considerable length of time, he was rather fortunate, for on several occasions with excellent deliveries by C. Wallis, which all but hit the timber, he was altogether beaten. His contribution was 11 runs. It was Grimsdell who pulled the "fat out of the fire," and during his stay at the wicket, he mixed patience with hitting power to good effect, and his score of 34 fairly represented

his play. There were other bright patches in the innings, mainly through B. Bolton (who was responsible for a six), and J. Atkins (16), who scored three fours out of his 16. 

CHESHAM v. CHESHAM CRICKET LEAGUE.

Played at the Cricket Ground, Newroad, and won by the home team. match was timed to start at two o'clock, but it was quite half-past two before a move was made, leaving only three and a half hours of play, as stumps were to be drawn at 6 o'clock, owing to the carnival. Chesham had a mixed team, there being five first eleven men and six reserves. The league team included three players from Social Club, three from Chartridge, two from Beechwoods, two from Amersham Hill Athletic Club (including the captain, W. E. Edwards), and one from Chesham Bois. Some of the cricketers in the league had started playing football. Edwards won the toss and elected to bat first, and L. Bates and H. Bruton opened the innings for the league.

A. Puddephatt secured Bates with the first ball he put down, Bates being caught by the Squire on the leg side. M. Grove followed in, and made things a bit more lively by scoring 18 runs. He was the only man to reach double figures. Grove was missed in the field two or three times. He was dismissed by Stone. A. E. Moreton then went in, and D. Spratley (who followed Bruton in) watched three the score-board reading 3—24; 4—24; 5—24; 6—24. W. Jackson made a stand, and managed to make half-a-dozen singles, and was then bowled by Pudde-phatt. The next three men failed to score, the board reading: 8-33; 9-33; 10-33. Stone was on his mettle with the ball, taking eight wickets for eight runs, which shows his quality as a bowler. One of the league players remarked in the interval that he felt very uncomfortable with Fred Goodger behind the stumps. This is one to "Freddie!" Lloyd-Roberts and E. Bates opened the innings for Chesham and these two carried the score to 45, thus passing the League's total for no wicket. All the Chesham men made double figures with one exception. When the Squire and Lloyd-Roberts got together the hitting was fast and furious. Lloyd-Roberts' score of 52 was a fine effort, without giving any great chance, and the Squire's score of 46 included seven fours, and a big hit for three. Chesham were out for the fine score of 167 runs for seven wickets. The league captain evidently did not wish to exert his bowlers, as he put nine men on to bowl during Chesham's innings. Scores :-

After an exciting small scoring game Chesham Bois won the match. This meant that each team had completed its league programme; each team claimed 14 points out of a possible 20; and the two were bracketed first at the top of the league. To decide the championship a further match will have to be played upon neutral ground. There was a large number of supporters

present to witness a good game,

The wicket proved very treacherous, the ball either shooting or rising awkwardly. Chesham Bois won the toss and batted first. Scoring did not run large; the fielding was as keen as mustard; and very little was let go; and Stubbings bowled especially well for Coleshill, going through the innings unchanged. Chesham Bois were out for the small total of 36. Stubbings claimed 8 wickets for 14 runs and Slade 2 for 16. A score of 36 did not seem a very big task for Coleshill, but against H. Thorne and W. Horwood they could only muster 30, six runs behind the Chesham Bois total. The fielding was again keen; Thorne and Horwood bowled unchanged; and Thorne took 3 for 12 and Horwood 6 for 16. MEMORIES OF A YOUNG FAN BY MR. GEOFFREY KEEN WRITTEN IN 1988

In the late 1920's at the age of 12 I became a fan through my weekly meeting with one of the players, Gordon Oakins, a wicket keeper. We talked cricket for ages and I finally decided to go and visit the common and see Chesham Bois in action.

From the first day I became addicted, I cannot remember the opposition but they were bowled out for 28 and we won easily. I remember Arnie Bolton (captain), Andy Horwood, Bill Horwood, Jack Reidleberg, Edgar Darvell, Harold Darvell, Harry Thorne, Ben Thorne, Gordon Oakins, and Percy Collins, who batted number eleven and fielded by the gorse, where he took some towering catches. It was great for a youngster like my self to be able to mingle with the great men on the common, where of course there was no pavilion, not even a shed, and everyone mixed together on the Amersham road side of the common. For away matches I used to cycle with a neighbour, who was a few years older than myself and able to "look after me", and show me the way to the various villages six or eight miles away. In the league were Holmer Green, Temple End, Missenden, Chartridge, Bellingdon, Ley Hill, Ashley Green and others.

There was no doubt that Chesham Bois were the masters in those days, with two bowlers, Harry Thorne and Edgar Darvell, who were playing well below their true standard. These two actually bowled unchanged for two complete seasons in the late twenties. It was almost a debacle if a team scored 40 against them. There where, however, bowlers of note in the other sides and a score of 40 could take some getting. These opposition bowlers included Harold Stratford (Temple End), Herby Smith (Holmer Green), Jack Pusey (Holmer Green), Frank Wells (Bellingdon), Frank Pearce (Bellingdon) to name but a few. The Bois, however, usually managed it with Andy, Arnie and Harold paving the way followed by Jack, Edgar and Harry supplying the big hitting if necessary.

Both Harry and Edgar were able to take their wickets at around three runs a piece throughout the seasons and both turned in tremendous performances at times. As I have said both were playing bellow their standard and Edgar Darvell proved this when he went to Chesham C.C. and became a prolific wicket taker for them. He then went on to represent Bucks on many occasions.

Batting wise Andy Horwood, Bill Horwood and Arnie Bolton were the technicians and scored most of the runs, but good technique did not always pay off on some wickets. Then the big hitting of Jack Reidleberg and Harry and Edgar Darvell would be needed and was usually forthcoming. Gordon Oatkins could always keep one end secure and pick up the singles, they were like gold dust on some wickets.

In the main Harry and Edgar were the big stars. Harry bowled round arm swingers at a good medium pace, at a time when movement through the air was not common outside the higher grades of cricket. Edgar relied more on pace off the wicket and an impeccable length.

Of course the village green wickets of the day gave them both considerable help, but on their day both would have posed problems for good batsmen on good wickets, as Edgar proved in later years.

For me the highlight of the four years I followed the team was about 1930, when they won the Chesham and District League and invited me to go to their Championship party at the Boot and Slipper.

A couple of years later I went into league cricket myself, not for the Bois but Ley Hill, where in my first match I had the doubtful honour of running out Percy Collins, off the last ball of the match, to defeat my former heroes by one run.

This season was to be the start of Chesham Bois winning the league division one title for three successive seasons. Again this season the team was captained by Arthur Cook.

Some Big Hitting; a Fine Stand.

Although to a certain, extent rain robbed the annual fixture between Chesham and Chesham League of some of its interest, nevertheless the match on Thursday was full of good points. Chesham lost two wickets fairly cheaply (for 39), a magnificent piece of field work securing Eric Bates run out, and a third at 71, a beautiful catch by Frank Webb, helding at square leg, disposing of Cyril Norman when he had a right to consider that his stroke was correct and a scorer. There was a push behind the ball, and it did not fall conveniently, but Webb took it like a master. The heavy shower which had stopped play and prolonged the tea hour had its effect upon the subsequent play, and with the bowlers not having full command of a greasy ball they came in for punishment from Ewart, who drove with tremendous force and scored 42 not out in ten minutes. To give the League a chance of a knock, Chesham declared with the score at 164 for 4. . This was an important top of the table clash, as the extensive report from the Bucks Examiner of Friday 1st September (Below) shows.

> When these teams played on the common earlier in the season the homesters ran up a total of 93, to which Holmer Green replied with 71 for nine wickets. Since then the Common lads have made totals of 93, 117 for five wickets, and 83 respectively, and taking such figures into consideration it was not too much to anticipate that last Saturday they would again rise to some kind of level which of late has characterised their performances. The game last week was what in sport is termed a "needle" match, for so persistently were Chesham Bois pushing the leaders that this game, or I should state, the result, had a distinct bearing on champlonship honours in the Chesham League.

The game in question had worked up a certain amount of interest also in other lengue teams and officials, indeed, one league umpire, who has travelled the district covered by the league, and with whom I had a chat on Saturday morning, had an idea that Chesham Bois would win this game. What explanation then can be put forward! for such a debacle, especially when, after losing nine wickets for nine runs, Harry Darvell and Sid Reynolds were able to put on fifteen for the last wicket.
