Chesham Bois lost at Westcott on Sunday in a close game. HARRY 'GHOSTY' ARIS
(1885 - 1973)

At this point it is fitting to say a few words about someone who played only the odd game for the club, when short of players, but played a large part in the club's history. That person is one Harry 'Ghosty' Aris who, in his time, was one of the village's best known characters.

(Harry did actually appear for The Moor C.C. in the 1928 and 1929 seasons)

Being listed in their averages for the 1929 season as printed in the Bucks Examiner

Commoner's rights were owned by people whose houses fronted the common, the last of these, in 1973, was Harry. He lived, with his sister Kitty, in Fern Cottage, opposite the present pavilion in North Road. It was the village bakery in the early 1900's.

He got his nickname of 'Ghosty' when he covered himself in a white sheet and scared the local company of the Church Lads Brigade, who practised their marching and parading on the common in the evenings, and also used the common for camping exercises. This incident took place before the Second World War.

Though not a player himself he supported the Cricket Club home and away, following them everywhere in a three wheeled 'Morgan' car up until his latter years.

He died in 1973 shortly after his sister, Kitty.

Another 'Ghosty' story relates to his sister. When passing the village pond one evening she heard splashing and moaning coming from the pond area. Thinking someone was drowning, in the 2 feet plus depth of water, in the pond at the time, she rushed home and alerted the neighbours. On returning to the pond they found, crouched in the bushes complete with a brick attached by string to a stick, which he was splashing in the water whilst letting forth a moaning sound was none other than Harry Aris.

A prank he admitted to in later years.
